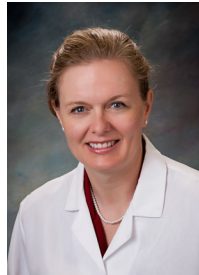

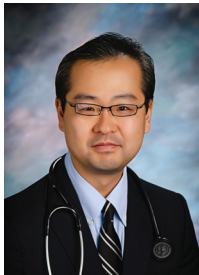

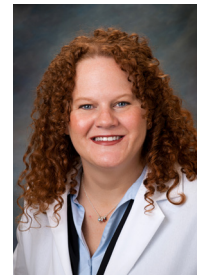

Does my regular provider get information from my hospital stay?

Yes. The hospitalists of Grand River Medical Group work closely with your primary care clinician during your hospital stay. This partnership allows you to receive high quality care during your stay and helps you focus on getting better. With your primary care clinician knowing the details of your hospital stay, they are able to coordinate your care and schedule any follow up appointments as necessary.

What happens when I leave the hospital?

After you leave the hospital, your primary care clinician will continue to manage your care and answer any medical questions you may have. Any follow up appointments you may need will be scheduled with your primary care clinician, not the hospitalist.

When would I receive care from a hospitalist?

Patients who are 18 years of age and older and have been admitted to the hospital will be treated and cared for by a hospitalist.
